



DRESS CODE

We have an optional Royal Blue school uniform which can be ordered and purchased from the school office.

Governors agreed that when pupils are off-site on a school trip or visit that a royal blue sweatshirt, jumper or cardigan should be worn for safeguarding reasons.

Governors request that all children come to school appropriately dressed. The school day is very varied, and children need to be comfortable and able to carry out activities.

- Sensible footwear ie no flip flops, open toe sandals, ballet pumps, trainers with wheels, high heels or no knee high boots
- Wellington Boots for wet or snowy weather
- Sensible clothing lengths - ie knee length skirts / long shorts / no 'low cut' or strappy tops
- During winter months children should have a warm, waterproof coat with them at all times
- During hot weather shoulders should be covered
- No hoods up, or hats are to be worn inside school
- No jewellery other than small ear studs or compulsory religious items may be worn - these should be removed for PE activities
- No make-up, except clear nail polish
- Hair should be tied back
- No role play outfits unless, of course it's a dress up day.

PE Kit

The children must have a PE bag and a change of clothes and footwear for PE.

Kit must include:

- Black or Navy PE shorts
- White T-shirt
- PE Pumps or trainers
- Jogging Bottoms and a sweatshirt for the winter months

All items should be named and should remain in a bag in school.

KS2 children who go swimming require:

- a swimming costume (not a bikini) for girls / trunks (not long shorts) for boys
