P.E. and SCHOOL SPORT

The Sports Leadership Council has continued to be a success. The children who moved into Year 6 this year remained on the Council and a group of Year 5 pupils was selected to join.



The inter-house competition programme has developed further this year with a football competition in the Autumn Term, a repeat of the indoor athletics in the Spring Term and Sports Day in the Summer Term. The Sports Leaders have again played a huge part in running each event.

We believe that the Sports Leadership Council concept is extremely valuable in terms of developing responsibility and leadership in the children. They have demonstrated commitment, maturity and enthusiasm in the decision-making, planning and running of the inter-house events.

We fine-tuned the organisation of Sports Day following the new format from last year. This allowed a seamless event with the timings perfectly planned and all the children again being able to participate in all the races, competing at their own ability level.



We have had a large number of children participating in competitions against other schools again this year (see Appendix 1), with some great successes! Two of our cross country runners went on to the County Finals at Princethorpe. Our netball players were again runners-up at the Year 5 tournament. Five children won their events at the District Athletics Tournament and then represented the District and the Central Area Finals in long jump, high jump, throwing and 800m. A Year 5 cricket team won their local competition and earned a place in the County Finals at Edgbaston. Our Year 5/6 rounders team won at the Level 2 competition, going on to represent the Central Area at the School Games County Finals in July. There was success at this level too for our Year 5/6 tennis players who also represented the Central Area at the Finals.



There was no swimming gala this year due to pool closure.

Unfortunately, due to adverse weather conditions and several events having to be rescheduled, we were unable to take part in some of the competitions over the year. (This was also the case for other schools in the area.)
