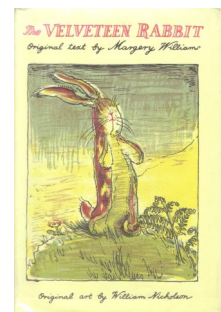
## Book Review
