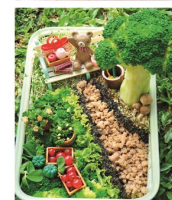
Miniature Garden Homecraft Competition

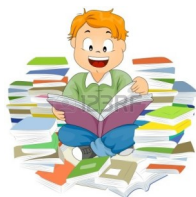

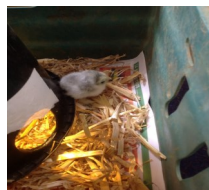
