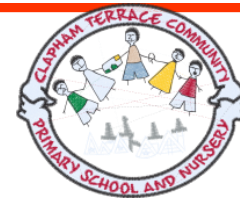

All children are encouraged to use this systematic approach if dealing with situations that they are not happy with.

Through assemblies and PSHE sessions, children are taught five stages to move through when dealing with conflict. We give them opportunities to practise body posture and eye contact and we also give them some useful phrases to use when operating the strategy and this means that they are always prepared. It is also important to emphasise the step 5 'report'; children know that they would not be expected to follow all five steps in the event of a serious incident or if they do not feel safe (in these cases, they would move straight to step 5). We want children to be empowered to sort out their own issues and be assertive, where appropriate as this is a skill they will need even more as they grow up.
