

Oceans	A large area of water, surrounded by land
River	A large flow of water, that crosses land, heading towards the ocean
Soil	The loose upper layer of the Earth's surface where plants grow
Valley	A long depression, or ditch, in Earth's surface
Vegetation	All plants that growth
