### A Visitor From Abroad

Last week, Mr Sandi from Bo, Sierra Leone, who is the headteacher of our link-school, came to visit us and talked about a new programme called Eco Bricks. Eco Bricks, which are made using large plastic bottles tightly filled with cut up plastic, are used to make bricks for houses. This project has already been very successful in Uganda, where they created a hut/house using mud as cement and the filled bottles as bricks. Mr Sandi's school is planning to make a structure in their school grounds. The plastics which we throw away take years to decompose and they turn into micro-plastics which contaminate the air and the water we drink and use. The plastics are also affecting the wildlife around the world. Eco bricks will put plastic to good use!
