#### **Key Knowledge**

Prophet Muhammad (pbuh) for Muslims is the last messenger of God. Other messengers include Adam, Abraham and Jesus – link to Jewish and Christian shared history.

Gandhi led the fight for Indian independence from the British Empire. He organized several non-violent civil disobedience campaigns.

Archbishop **Desmond Tutu** (born 7 October 1932) is a South African social rights activist. He won the Nobel Peace Prize in 1983 for his work fighting apartheid in South Africa.

<b>Key Vocabulary</b>	
<b>Ahimsa (Hindu)</b>	respect for all living things and avoidance of violence towards others
<b>Grace (Christian)</b>	the love and mercy given by God because God desires people to have it, not necessarily because of anything they have done to earn it
<b>Ummah (Muslim)</b>	the whole community of Muslims bound together by ties of religion
<b>Zakat (Muslim)</b>	the third Pillar of Islam, the giving of 2.5% of ones wealth each year to the poor
<b>Karma</b>	the result of a person's actions as well as the actions themselves. It is a term about the cycle of cause and effect.
<b>Forgiveness (Christian)</b>	making a decision to free yourself from holding on to resentment and feelings of revenge toward someone who hurt you
<b>Commitment</b>	being dedicated to a cause, activity etc
