They will use vocabulary relating to ambitions and jobs.</p>	<p>All about ourselves Children will learn to describe their own appearance and are introduced to some key grammatical features of French, such as the position of adjectives. They will talk about their emotions and health, developing their conversational skills.</p>	<p>That's tasty Children will learn specific vocabulary relating to drinks, breakfast, sandwich fillings and pizzas. They will learn key phrases within which to use these phrases.</p>	<p>Family and friends Children will expand their vocabulary and consolidate their understanding of descriptive language, including subjective descriptions. They will learn how French adjectives must 'agree' with the noun they describe. They will find out more about possessive adjectives and explain a family network in detail.</p>	<p>School life Children will learn key vocabulary related to objects, subjects and prepositional language. Children will learn the names of 2D shapes. 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Early Years and Key Stage One

Children experience a range of languages through practical activities and real life experiences. These activities prepare them for Key Stage 2 where they begin learning French in discreet lessons. Throughout Early Years and Key Stage One children will enjoy songs, stories and rhymes in French and languages relevant to the school community.

EYFS	<p>Children will learn to listen attentively to spoken language. Language is celebrated in the learning environment. Children have opportunities to share and celebrate languages spoken at home with their peers. Different cultures will be explored and learnt about through Understanding the World. Early Years pupils take part in whole school language and international days. French is introduced through counting and daily routines such as answering the register.</p>
Year 1	<p>Children take part in whole school language and international days. Children will answer the register in French and languages relevant to the class. They will give their lunch choice in French. Children will learn to greet each other in French.</p>
Year 2	<p>Children take part in whole school language and international days and are offered the opportunity to join a Spanish club run by an external provider. Children will consolidate language skills learnt in Year 1 and EYFS. They will learn to respond to a wider range of classroom instructions in French.</p>

Key Stage Three

Children continue to learn French, building on their knowledge and skills, when they move into Key Stage Three in local secondary schools. They are also introduced to Spanish and German and can apply their language learning skills to these languages.
