We will be sticking your child's log in details into their reading diary. You should have these by mid next week at the latest. If you log on, you can have a look at Class Dojo. You will not see it populated yet, as it is not something we will be using unless we have to isolate a bubble. Should this happen, you will receive more information from your class teacher about how to access the daily learning that will be set for each child on Class Dojo and how you can upload their learning or communicate with the teacher through this platform during the period of any lockdown. For those children who find themselves in a situation where they have to self-isolate, we will provide a learning pack which will cover the literacy, numeracy, science and topic learning. The admin team will be on hand to help you if you are in this situation.

### Year 6 visit Coventry

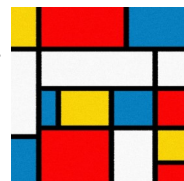
Year 6 really enjoyed their WW2 trip to Coventry. They participated in a workshop, learning about rationing, transport in the blackout and evacuees.
