## Sports Leadership Council

This year we have had 15 Sports Leaders and 8 Sports Ambassadors, who have been successfully leading events in and outside school. The Ambassadors have worked with our School Games organiser in four training sessions throughout the year. This led them to working as excellent role models at internal and external competitions, where they lead groups and recorded scores. They all joined the end of year virtual celebration where they reflected on their achievements with Ambassadors from lots of other schools. The Leaders have worked in school to lead house events, develop a playground leader rota and ensure playground equipment is organised and taken outside. In this short year, our House Events have included: indoor athletics, dodgeball and a Marathon Kids running competition. Every child has participated and represented their house team, adults throughout school joined in the running competition to celebrate our fantastic participation and sportsmanship.

Next year, Sports Leaders will aim to reach 20 children across year 5 and 6. This will then allow house events to move to a rota system of leader teams, to enable more children to access the leadership role opportunity.

## Competition

This year we received the School Games Values Award for upholding the values passion, determination, respect, teamwork, self-belief and honesty. This reflects how the values have become embedded in our school environment and when children attend inter-school competition they represent Clapham with pride and respect. This has come as a result of our house events changing to a values based scoring system, which has enabled all children to be aware of the School Games values. In addition to the values award, our KS1 gymnastics team placed 1<sup>st</sup> at their event and would have

gone onto regional finals under different circumstances. The Year 5 dodgeball team made it through to a regional competition after entering a video to showcase the rules of dodgeball. This was passed on and used by the Youth Sport Trust at a national event. The Year 5 and 6 football team played 4 of their 7 matches and remain undefeated – a fantastic season with a goal tally of 26. Finally, the Sports Hall Athletics squad won the first round of competition and made it into the regional finals where they placed 5<sup>th</sup>. This was a huge achievement having not ever made it this far in this competition and 5th out of over 200 schools in Coventry and Warwickshire.

### Physical Education

Our broad and balanced curriculum has been implemented and adapted to an outstanding level. Teachers have tracked progress using Pic Collages, to show pupil voice and lesson evidence. This has worked well and we are continuing to develop the use of Pic Collage evidence to reflect pupil progress. Every class has received two hours of PE each week, with the addition of Marathon Kids sessions at least twice each week. Year 1 and Reception have worked hard to achieve MK every morning and we aim to continue this delivery as they move up through the school. This will ensure it becomes embedded in every year group's routine.

Our PE curriculum has been enhanced by our use of outside providers, who offer specialised sports such as Ju Jitsu and yoga. An addition this year, has been Mr Smith, who provides extra-curricular clubs as well as delivery throughout the school day of additional activities to PE lessons. We will continue to work with Mr Smith, who has been an excellent practitioner throughout our school, upheld high expectations of behaviour and worked successfully to deliver PE skills lessons in EYFS.

## Community Links

Community links have continued to be a valuable part of our PE and School Sport. Due to ongoing work at Campion school, our links with the PE department and access to facilities have been limited this year. However, we have been able use the new local leisure centre facilities to facilitate our competitions. New links we have created this year are with the local dodgeball team. The team was setup and ran by a team GB and England dodgeball athlete. Taking this opportunity, we invited the athlete in to school to join our house competition, run a skills workshop and this led to him working with the School Games provider to run the whole cluster dodgeball competition.

We have continued to work with WASPS rugby, All Stars cricket and WASPS netball (unfortunately the netball event didn't take place).

Looking forward to next year, we will be attending a basketball competition ran by the Morton Morell college and hoping to setup a new intra-schools netball league.

## Achievements

We have again achieved the School Games Gold Mark for our provision and inclusivity and participation. This award includes reviewing our provision, creating a heat-map to track activity throughout the school day, monitoring participation throughout the school at inter and intra school events, as well as outlining our provision and attendance to extra-curricular clubs. We continue to hold the AfPE Quality Mark with Distinction and are on track for our goals to be reviewed in 2021. At competitions up to Spring term, we achieved first place in gymnastics, first place in sports hall athletics and finished in first position in the football league.
