We've only been back one week and already we have some good news. I am delighted to announce that Clapham Terrace has been awarded a Gold Mark in EAL (English as an Additional Language). The award looks at Leadership,



Teaching/Learning/Assessment and working with the community. Our school prides itself in the diversity of its pupil and families and the number of languages that our pupils can speak in addition to English. Thank you very much to the children and parents who spoke to the assessor and to Mrs Batchelor for all her hard work in securing this award for school.

Thank you also to parents and carers for their incredible support for the Great Clapham Fun Run and Break the Rules Day. The Run raised a staggering £3,193 (before the addition of Gift Aid), with some children raising well over £100 each! Break the Rules Day also did really well, raising £475. Money raised will go towards funding a playground activity wall and a Marathon Kids track. The Rag Bag textile-recycling scheme was very successful, with over 260 kilogrammes collected. This equates to over £100 for us, and the added benefit of a less cluttered house for you!
