Another very busy week in school has flown by! The children have enjoyed an Egyptian Day in Year 3 and 4, a Victorian Day in Year 5 and 6, as well as a visit from our Reading Patron. Active learning is well underway and the children's behaviour has been fantastic around school. Our Inclusion Quality Mark (IQM) visit was extremely positive on Thursday. Assessors spent the day talking to children and to a number of parents about the inclusive provision Clapham provides. A huge thank you to Mrs Clarkson who leads in this area across school. As soon as the report is published we will share it with you.

The children experienced a whole school assembly in their class groups this week; it worked well, as we are lucky enough to have a large hall space and were able to keep classes quite separate. We are planning to do the same with our achievement assembly on Fridays.

I participate in a weekly telephone conference with the Local Authority where heads are kept up to date with the latest local issues and guidance regarding Covid. At the beginning of term we were strongly encouraged to use our bubble system for the first few weeks, but the latest LA advice is moving away from this. Therefore next week we will move towards having one break time rather than our staggered approach and the children will mix across phases (Year Nursery with Reception, Year 1 with 2, Year 3 with 4, and Year 5 with 6). We will however keep our staggered dinner time arrangements for the time being whilst we embed the change to breaktime.

As for having parents in school, we will remain cautious, evaluating the open sessions in Year 1 and 2 this week and updating our risk assessment accordingly as we progress through the term.

May I thank you for your rapid departure at the end of the school day—this is going very well so far and enables us to continue with this approach at the end of the school day.

Next Monday night, we have our Home School Association AGM at 7.30pm at school. It's a great way to meet other parents and be involved in school life. It also gives you a chance to put forward any fundraising ideas you may have and thoughts about how funds can be spent to enrich the children's school experience. The meeting will be in the hall with social distance measures in place and we ask that you wear a mask if possible. Hope to see you there!


### **Book Week**
