## UNICEF Podcast

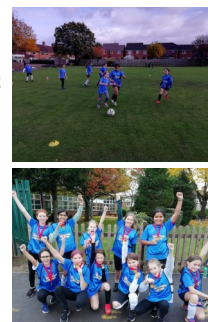
