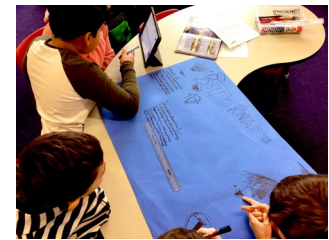
Space Assembly
