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ART: Children will explore a range of different techniques such as drawing, painting and sculpture, and will use a variety of materials, from pencil and paint to charcoal and clay, to create their own art pieces.

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COMPUTING: In Year 2 children will build upon and develop the skills learnt in Year 1. They will also learn how to use the internet and technology safely. Children will use their skills across the curriculum. Computing topics this year will include; programming on screen using rapid router, staying safe online, using the internet and creating graphs and e books. They will learn how to log into the school laptops and various learning sites such as Spelling Shed and Times Table Rock Star.

DESIGN & TECHNOLOGY: This subject includes cooking, with children finding out about a healthy diet and preparing food. It also includes the more traditional design elements in which children will design, make and evaluate products while learning to use a range of tools and techniques for construction.

PE: Children will develop their skills in gymnastics, dance, athletics and invasion games. They will also learn to play games which teach the importance of simple tactics and team work. They will learn how to warm up safely and how physical activity is part of a healthy life style.

RE and PSHE: RE
teaching will follow the
Warwickshire Syllabus
and is structured around
'Big Questions'. Children
will learn about belonging
to a faith community,
special and sacred times,
Christian beliefs and
sacred places.

PSHE teaching will follow the Jigsaw scheme beginning with 'Being me in my World'. GEOGRAPHY: In Key Stage 1, children will learn to compare locations beginning with covering Geography units such as London to Madagascar. We will cover a range of skills and use map work to enjoy Geography lessons across the year.

MUSIC: Children will listen to and perform a range of music. This will include singing, body percussion and the use of tuned and un-tuned percussion. They will begin to learn the vocabulary associated with music such as beat, rhythm and score. They will also learn about pitch, and tempo & dynamics.

HISTORY: In history in Key Stage 1 there is a focus on key historical events, famous people and history relevant to the local area. In the Autumn term children will learn about the Great Fire of London.
