# What is the Sports Premium?

The Government is providing funding of £150 million per annum for the academic years 2013/2014, 2014/2015 and 2015/2016 to improve the provision of physical education (P.E) and sport in Primary Schools. This funding is being jointly provided by the Department for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sports., and will be allocated to Primary school Headteachers to spend on improving the quality of sport and P.E for all their children. The sports funding can only be spent on sport and P.E provision in schools. Funding will be calculated by reference to the number of primary-aged pupils (between the ages of 5 and 11) as recorded in the annual schools census in January 2015.

#### Summary of School Sports Funding Spending 2015/2016

Objectives in spending School Sport's Funding:

The Head teacher and P.E subject leader are committed to ensuring that all pupils receive at least two hours of high quality physical education per week, delivered by confident, well trained sports coaches. The successful delivery of the curriculum supports all aspects of health education within the school. The Dance curriculum has been enhanced through the use of Sports Funding, a dance specialist has worked alongside staff throughout the Autumn Term.

Regular staff training is provided to teachers and teaching assistants to keep them abreast of new initiatives, ensuring the P.E is a high profile subject.

Monitoring lessons ensures that they are planned and delivered to a high standard, guaranteeing both pupils enjoyment and achievement. The school holds a whole school sports day, which include traditional, competitive races. (house system, interhouse sports days).

The school takes part in competitions with local primary schools in the Leamington Consortium, such as football, netball, cross country and athletics.
